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Dear Mr Stephenson,

On behalf of the Director General for the Office for National Statistics (ONS), I have been asked to reply to your Parliamentary Question asking the Secretary of State for Work and Pensions what estimate he has made of the level of youth unemployment in Pendle constituency in each of the last five years; and if he will make a statement. (211614)

The ONS compiles labour market statistics for areas smaller than the UK from the Annual Population Survey (APS) following International Labour Organisation (ILO) definitions.

Table 1 shows the number of people aged 16 to 24 who were unemployed according to survey responses from the APS for the 12 month period July 2013 to June 2014, the latest available period, and for the 12 month periods ending June from 2010 to 2013.

Guide to Quality:

The Coefficient of Variation (CV) indicates the quality of an estimate, the smaller the CV value the higher the quality. The true value is likely to lie within +/- twice the CV - for example, for an estimate of 200 with a CV of 5% we would expect the population total to be within the range 180-220.

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As with any sample survey, estimates from the APS are subject to a certain level of uncertainty. A guide to the quality of the estimates of the levels is included on the tables. It should be noted that the estimates provided for Pendle constituency are considered too unreliable for practical purposes. Consequently caution should be exercised when using or drawing conclusions from the estimates.

As an alternative measure, table 2 shows the number of people aged 18 to 24 who were claiming Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) in Pendle in September 2014, the latest available period, and for September from 2010 to 2013.
